Muslims in SA



Muslims have a long history in South Australia. They came to the state in the 1800s and contributed a lot to the society. The first Muslims were the Afghan cameleers who played a crucial role in the development of the state's interior. They established trade routes for goods and services, including transport of wool and supplies to remote outback stations.



Business



ABN, Australian Business Number, is an 11-digit identifier used to identify businesses in Australia for tax and record-keeping purposes. An individual can apply for an ABN to work as a contractor or be self-employed, including for temporary jobs like Uber driving etc. Know more about ABN www.business.gov.au

ACN, or Australian Company Number, is a nine-digit identifier assigned to every company registered in Australia. It is a legal requirement for companies to have registered ACN. The ACN does not provide information about the company's structure, ownership or activities. Know more about ACN <u>www.asic.gov.au</u>

In Australia, there are two common types of business structures: sole trader and company. Each has its own pros and cons, which are summarized below:

A Sole Trader is an individual who owns and operates their business alone. The main advantages of being a sole trader are complete control over the business and easy setup.

The main disadvantages are unlimited personal liability and limited resources for growth. A Company is a legal entity owned by shareholders, and it provides limited liability protection to its owners. The main advantages of a company are limited liability, access to more resources, and perpetual existence.

The main disadvantages are higher setup and maintenance costs and increased regulation and oversight.

Overall, choosing between a sole trader and a company depends on the business' size, complexity and risk: with sole traders being better suited for smaller businesses and companies for larger ones with growth potential.

Healthcare

While hospitals cater primarily to emergency cases and elective surgeries in Australia, all other medical conditions are seen by General Practitioners (GP). If an expert opinion is mandated, your GP will refer you to a specialist at a particular hospital.

General practitioners are present in most suburbs. You can book an appointment with your GP either by directly ringing the practice or online via the HealthEngine website/app.





If you are a citizen or a permanent resident and have a Medicare card, you can visit a "bulk billing" practice. This means that you will not be charged any out of pocket fees. It is worth noting that some GP practices tend to charge a gap fee, especially when the consultation is out of hours or the practice is over booked.

Temporary residents and students on private health cover can also access GP practices using the same fee structure. People on visit visas are also entitled to healthcare by a GP using cash if they are not privately insured.

Irrespective of your visa status or citizenship, in case of a medical emergency dial 000 to call an ambulance.

Private Health Insurance

Private health insurance is mandatory for those who are not eligible for Medicare. For example students and temporary residents. Transport

Transportation in South Australia is primarily reliant on road and rail networks. The state has a well-developed road system, including the major highways of the South Eastern Freeway, Sturt Highway, and Princes Highway, which connect the capital city of Adelaide to regional areas and other states.

The Adelaide Metro provides public transportation within the city, including bus and train services, while regional areas are served by private bus companies.
